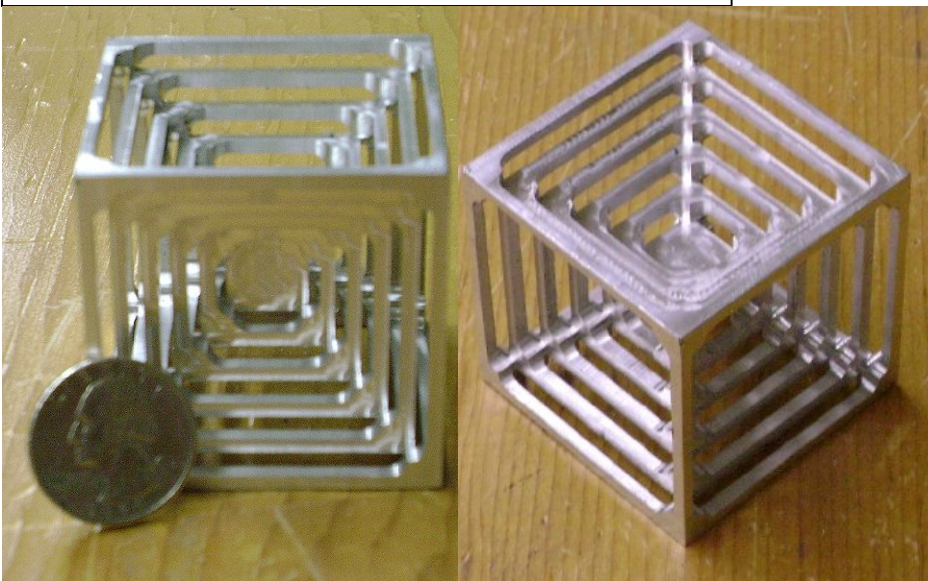
Next meeting: 10-14-09 7:30 PM Macomb Community College South Campus Room R-128.
