For the show and tell part of the meeting, member Mark brought in a project he is working on, an aluminum digital readout bracket that he joined together using Harbor Freight aluminum brazing rod. Much discussion followed about this type of process for joining aluminum. Mark also shared information on a casting foundry furnace that he recently purchased from a company called Vevor. This furnace can also be used for heat treating. Mark has an upcoming project where he will put this furnace to work and he has promised to share his progress, and the use of the furnace, at an upcoming meeting.

Member Mike B. brought in the three engines that he has been working on. The one pictured at right, Model M19, was purchased on E-Bay and is a good running engine. The engine shown at bottom right, a Stewart Turner Sun Model, 2 cycle, was purchased used and needed a lot of TLC, including the repair of the bent crankshaft.
